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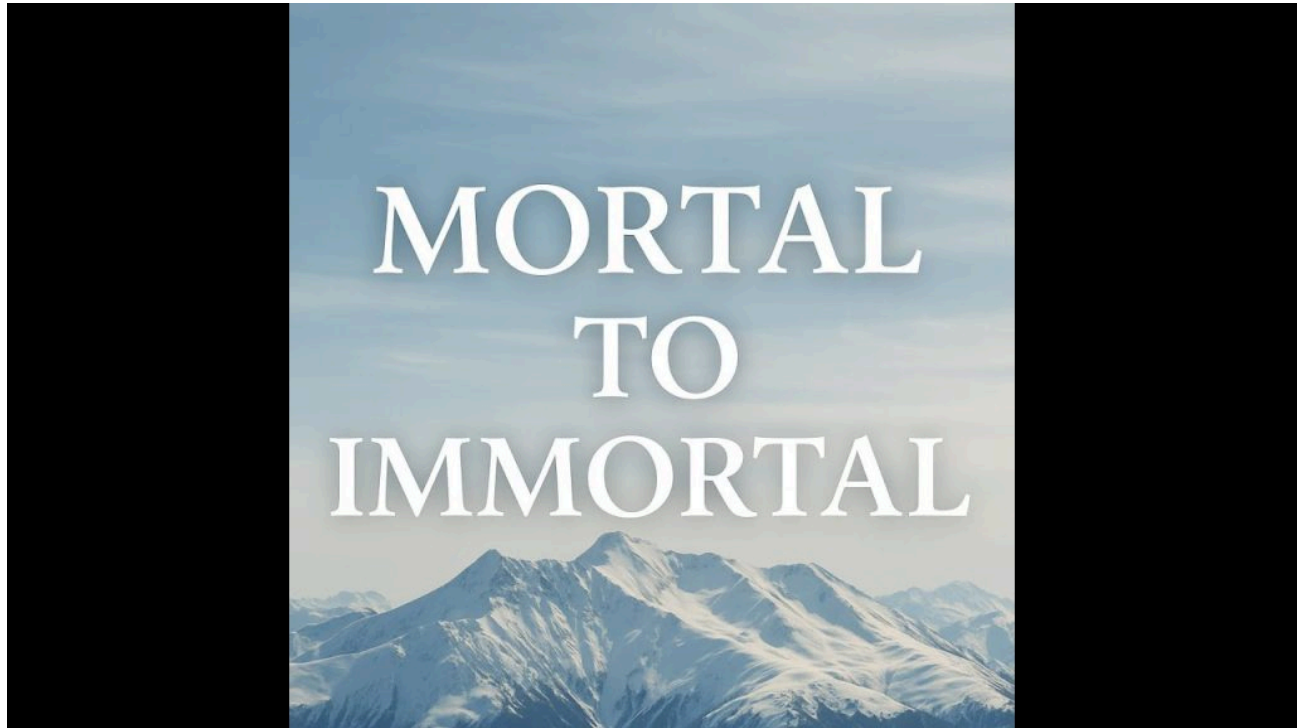

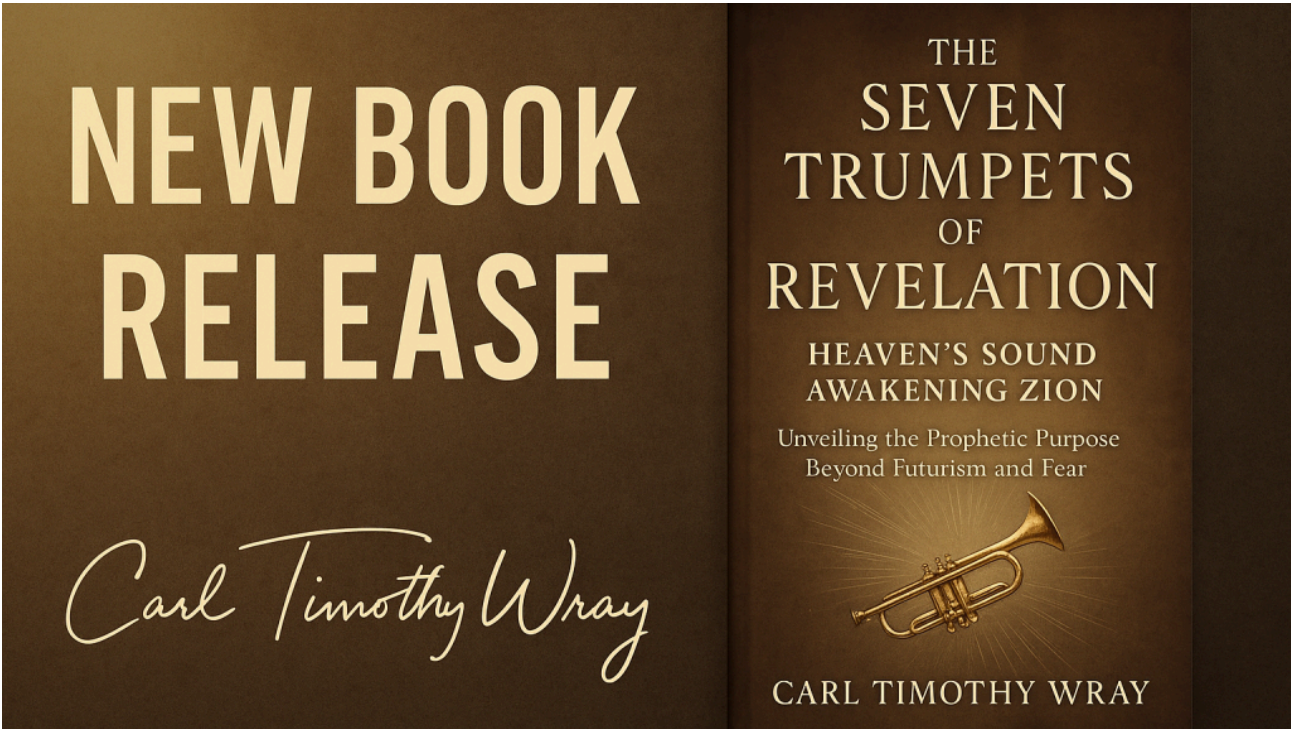
The Book of Revelation — Full Overview

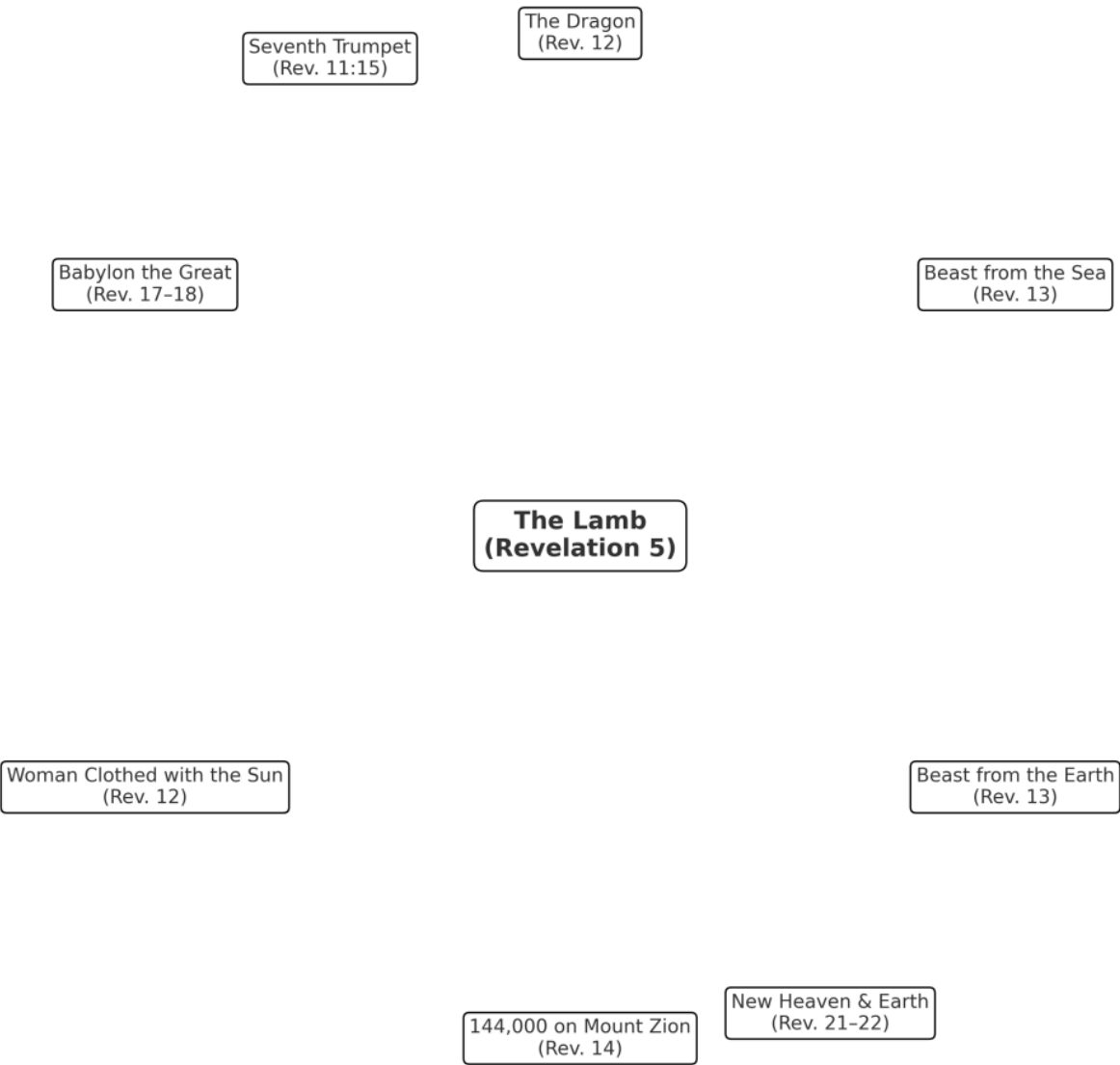

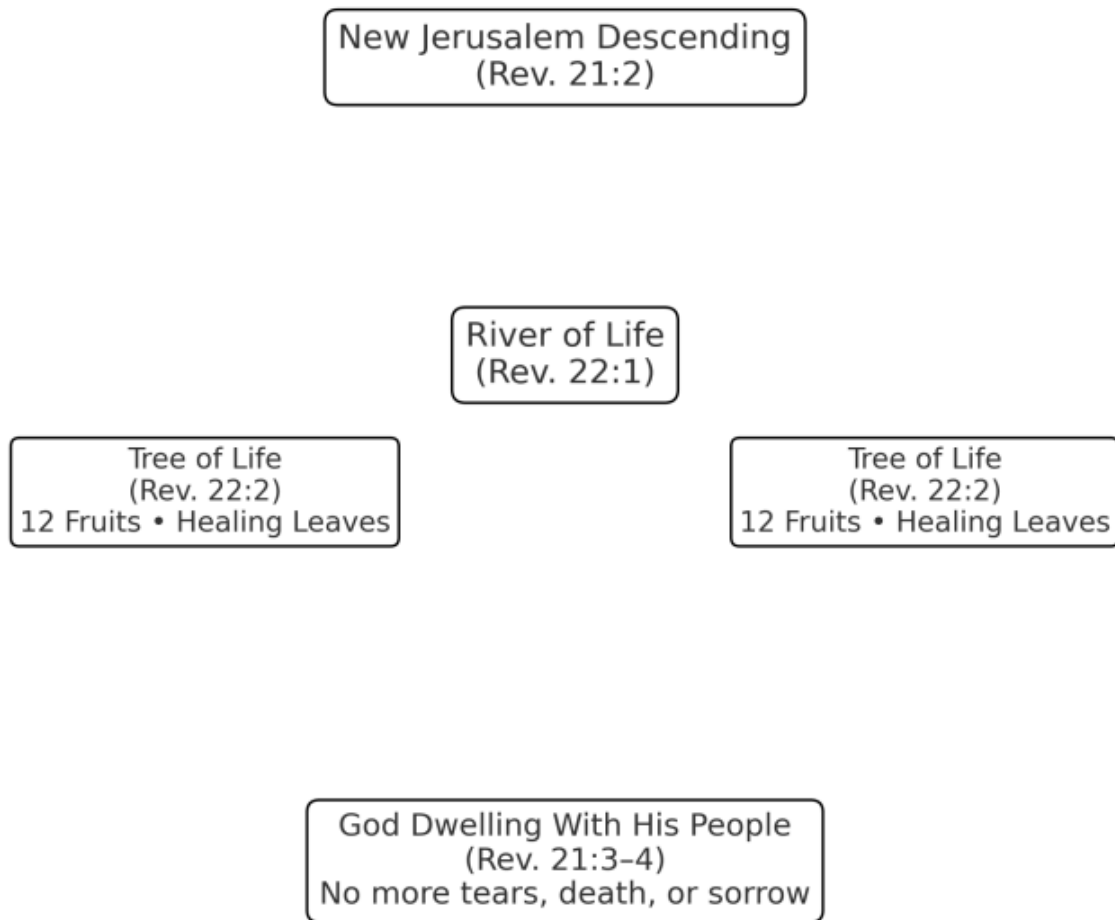
Symbol Map of Revelation
