CHAPTER 1

This is the governing center of the entire Book of Revelation. Nothing proceeds from the earth upward. Everything proceeds from the throne downward.

The throne represents authority. It represents administration. It represents the place from which all things are governed. The Book of Revelation does not begin with horses, seals, or judgments. It begins with the throne, because the throne is the source of everything that follows.

This is critical to understand, because when the Red Horse Rider appears later in the Book of Revelation, he does not appear as an independent authority. He appears as part of what proceeds from the throne.

The throne establishes the order.

The throne establishes the source.

The throne establishes the administration.

The Scroll in the Right Hand of Him Who Sat on the Throne

In Revelation chapter five, John sees a scroll in the right hand of Him who sat on the throne. The scroll is written within and on the backside, sealed with seven seals.

This is why the Book of Revelation is an unveiling, not an invention.

John weeps when no one is found worthy to open the scroll.
