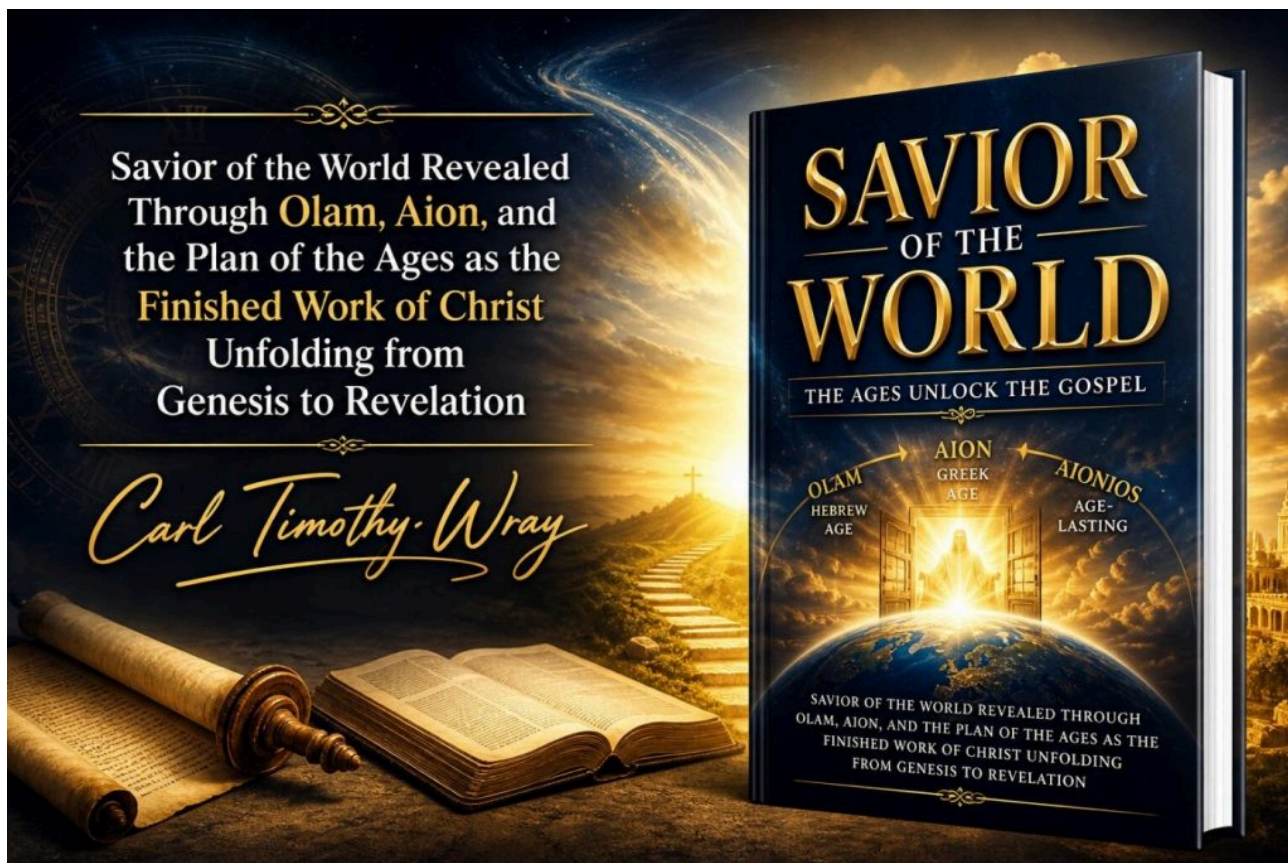

Jehovah Olam is not merely the God who exists without end—He is the God whose purpose extends beyond the limits of human sight.

GOD WORKS THROUGH AGES, NOT MOMENTS

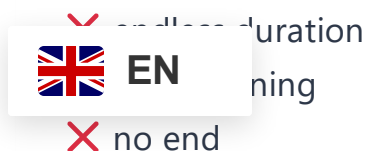
