

This song cannot be taught by the systems of men because it originates from the throne within. Religion may echo the lyrics, but only revelation carries the tone. The sound of the redeemed is the rhythm of divine life made audible through consciousness.

When the sons sing, creation listens. Their song heals, restores, and awakens. It carries the frequency of reconciliation, the sound that draws all things back into order. It is the same tone heard at creation's dawn — now amplified in redeemed humanity.

Chapter 10


