## **Chapter 10 — The Fulfillment of the Third Seal: Christ Fully Formed Through Divine Measurement**

**“Till We All Come... Unto the Measure of the Stature of  
the Fulness of Christ”**

The balances were never the destination.

They were the process.



They were never the final picture.

The Third Seal does not end with Christ holding the balances.

Peter confirmed this:

This is completion.

The Lamb who opened the seal...

Paul declared:

“Christ in you, the hope of glory.” — Colossians 1:27

This is the fulfillment of the Third Seal.

Christ no longer merely measuring.

Christ now fully formed.
