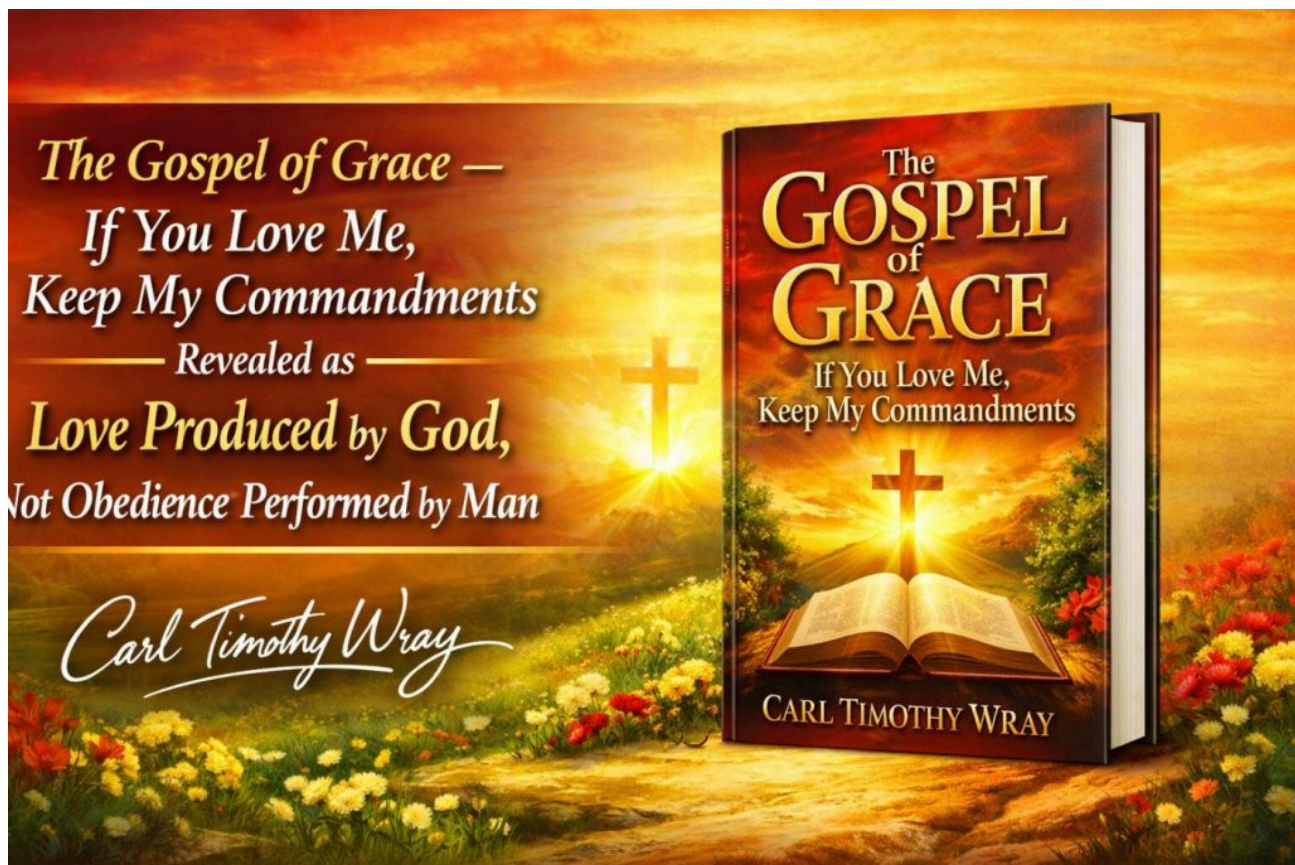

There are few verses in Scripture that have carried more weight, more pressure, and more misunderstanding than the words of Jesus in John 14:15:

John 14:15

“For if you love me, keep my commandments.”



For many, this verse has not sounded like good news.
