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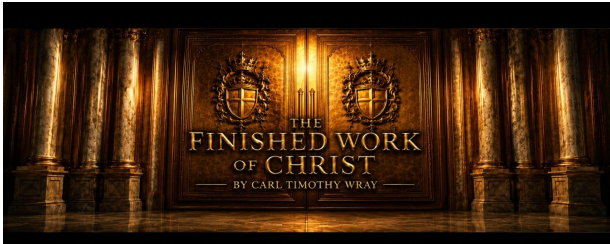

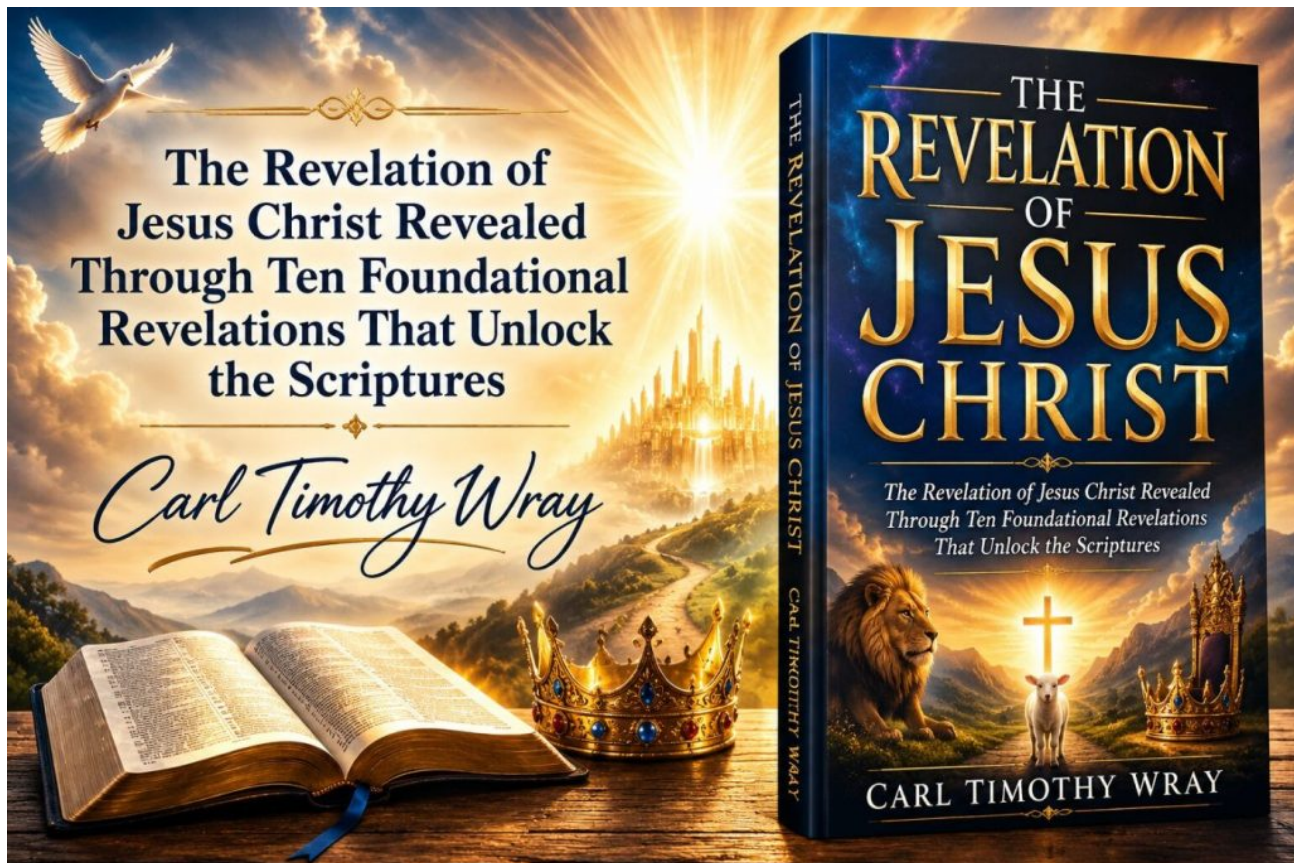

Jesus Christ is the Lamb who stands at the center of God's eternal counsel.

Colossians 3:4
