The stone that became a mountain is the Kingdom of God filling every space. Nothing remains untouched — His glory covers the earth as the waters cover the sea.

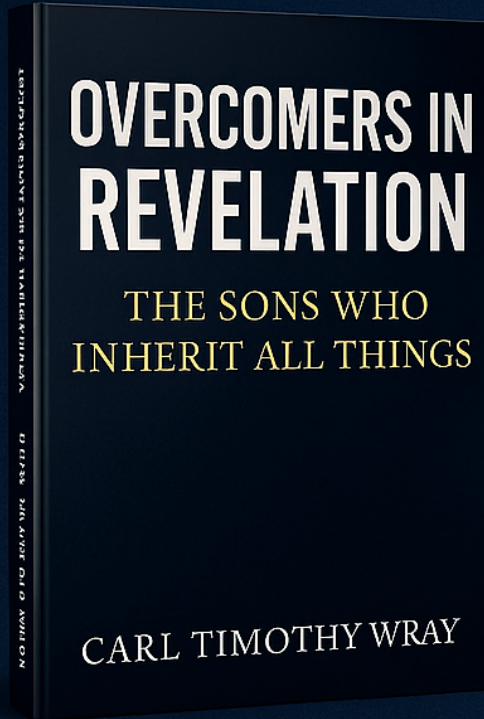
The Inheritance of the Sons
