## Key Revelation

## Chapter Four

## The 144,000 on Mount Zion — The Company of Firstfruits

## **\*** Introduction

After seeing the Lamb open the scroll of destiny, John is shown a company standing with Him on Mount Zion (Revelation 14:1). They are not a scattered, defeated people — but a sealed, victorious company. They stand in the high place, in union with the Lamb, as the firstfruits unto God and the Lamb.

"Behold, the tabernacle of God is with men, and He will dwell with them." — Revelation 21:3


"And the city had no need of the sun, neither of the moon... for the glory of God did lighten it, and the Lamb is the light thereof." — Revelation 21:23
